LIGHT OF HOPE, FAITH, JOY AND PEACE

Objectives:

At the end of the Kids Assembly, MFC Kids will be able to:

- Understand the meaning of Advent wreath as our tradition during advent
- 2. Realize the importance of advent as preparation for the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ
- 3. Let the light of Christ in us, shine brighter this Christmas Season



Activity: Video Watching about Advent wreath

Directions:

- Show the video to the kids for them to appreciate the season of advent.
- Ask them what are the things that they are excited about Christmas.
- Processing: A saint is a person who is believed to be especially close to God! As kids, we also want to be close to God. And as the lyrics of the song says - "When the Saints go marching in, Lord, how I want to be in that number!" How we want to be there - to be one with them with God.



II. HEAD

Christmas celebration is a season that is full of light and life! There are many ways that we can do, as we prepare for Christmas. As Catholics, we called this preparation Advent Season.

During Advent, we celebrate by putting up an Advent Wreath and lighting candles each week. The use of the wreath and candles during Advent is a longstanding Catholic tradition that was originally adopted by Christians in the Middle Ages as part of their spiritual preparation for Christmas.

The wreath and candles are full of symbolism tied to the Christmas season. The wreath itself, which is made of various evergreens, signifies continuous life. The circle of the wreath, which has no beginning or end, symbolizes the eternity of God, the immortality of the soul, and the everlasting life we find in Christ. Let's celebrate this year's Christmas by appreciating the light of Jesus through an Advent wreath.



The Advent season is a time of preparation for our hearts and minds for the anniversary of the Lord's birth on Christmas. Having a proper understanding of the message of the advent wreath and candles may help us to be spiritually prepared for Christmas.

Advent encompasses the four Sundays and weekdays leading up to the celebration of Christmas and in these 4 celebrations of the Eucharist. Sundays of Advent, the lighting of a candle can be accompanied by a Bible reading, devotional time, and prayers. God teaches us HOPE, FAITH, JOY, and PEACE!

Romans 15:13

"May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit."

Candle symbolizes the light of God coming into the world through the birth of His son, Jesus.

1. HOPE. (The prophet's candle)

Romans 15:12-13

"And again Isaiah says: "The root of Jesse shall come, raised up to rule the Gentiles; in him shall the Gentiles hope." May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of the holy Spirit.

Hope for kids means - "a desire together with the expectation of getting what is wanted." The first candle of the Advent wreath, the prophecy candle, or candle of hope. It represents the expectation felt in anticipation of the coming Messiah. He is the most awaited savior of the people.

In this world that is full of darkness, hope is like a light shining in a dark place. Jesus is the source of hope! As we look at the light of the candle, we celebrate the hope that we have in Jesus Christ.

2. FAITH. (The Bethlehem Candle)

Luke 3:4-6

"As it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah: A voice of one crying out in the desert: Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths. Every valley shall be filled and every mountain and hill shall be made low. The winding roads shall be made straight, and the rough ways made smooth, and all flesh shall see the salvation of God."

Faith is trusting in something or someone. Faith in God is believing that He can and will do all that He has promised. The second is called the Bethlehem candle, or the candle of preparation. The second candle of the Advent wreath reminds us to prepare the way of the Lord.

Mama Mary and St. Joseph journeyed a lot of high and low for miles as they travel to Bethlehem, but despite that, they continue their mission. They don't fully understand God's plan at that time but had faith in the promise of God.

May we have the faith that they have in God. May our faith in Christ give us peace despite all chaos happening around us.

3. JOY (The Shepherds Candle)

Luke 2:10

"The angel said to them, 'Do not be afraid; for behold, I proclaim to you good news of great joy that will be for all the people."

Joy is a feeling of pleasure or happiness that comes from success, good fortune, or a sense of well-being. The third candle is pink and symbolizes joy. It is pink because rose is a liturgical color for joy. The third Sunday of Advent is Gaudete Sunday and is meant to remind us of the joy that the world experienced at the birth of Jesus.

It is an anticipation of the birthday of Jesus! If there is a birthday celebration, there would be joy. Let's rejoice because we will celebrate the birthday of our Lord Jesus Christ. May it help us to experience the true joy that no one can take away from us.

4. PEACE (The Angel's candle)

Luke 2:14

"Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests."

Peace means freedom, harmony or a quiet and calm state of mind. On the fourth week of Advent, we light the final purple candle to mark the final week of prayer and penance as we wait for the birth of our Savior. This final candle,

the "Angel's Candle" symbolizes peace. It reminds us of the message of the angels: "Peace on Earth, Good Will Toward Men."

Remember that Jesus is the Prince of Peace! When we have Jesus in our hearts, we have His peace within us. The peace that we have because of His great love for us. Another for Jesus is Emmanuel, it means God is with us! He came to us to give us HOPE, FAITH, JOY and PEACE!



A. For Kids at Play (3-4 years old)

Activity 1: Coloring Activity

Materials:

- Printed copy of handout (See Appendices A, B and C for the materials)
- Coloring Materials

B. For First Step (5-6 years old) and Foot Step (8-10 years old)

Activity: Advent Wreath Making

Materials:

- Bond Paper
- Scissors
- Pen/Pencil
- Colored Paper (Green, Purple, Orange & Pink)
- Glue

Instructions:

- Draw out a circle and a candle in your band paper.
- Cut out your colored/construction paper into small pieces
- Put glue or paste in your candles and advent wreath drawing.
- Put your cut out paper into your drawing.
- Use green paper in the circle part of the wreath. Use purple and pink for the candle and orange paper for its fire.
- Done! You have finished creating your Advent Wreath craft.



C. Step Up (11-12 years old)

Activity: Household

Discussion question:

- 1. What is hope, faith, joy and peace for you?
- 2. What is your prayer to Jesus this Christmas Season?



IV. TAKE AWAY

Jesus the Light of the World! In every candle that we lit in the advent candle, Jesus is showing us that His light is our, HOPE, FAITH, JOY and PEACE! This is the plan of God for us.

John 8:12

"Jesus spoke to them again, saying, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life.""

We will never live in darkness, as long that we have Jesus! Jesus alone can conquer all the darkness. May we always follow Him our true light!

3. I will be an active member of MFC Kids


- I will always attend and participate in all MFC Kids activities.
