KIDS ASSEMBLY TOPIC FOR THE MONTH OF DECEMBER.

TITLE:

My Hope is Jesus

OBJECTIVES:

At the end of the Kids Assembly, MFC Kids will be able to:

- Know that Jesus is the greatest gift given to us by the Father.
- Remember that Jesus is our hope and is always with us.
- Share hope with others by following Jesus.

MOTIVATION:

Activity: Hope Shines

1. Everyone starts in a circle standing or sitting.

2. One child is given the “Light”.

Tell them: “This is hope. When we pass hope to others, it grows.”

3. The child moves and tags someone.

They walk, skip, or gently tag a friend.

They pass the Light object to the person they tagged.

Then they sit or move outside the circle to show they’ve already “shared hope.”

4. The new person repeats the pattern.

They take the Light and tag someone who has not received it yet.

5. The game continues until everyone has received the Light.

When all kids have been tagged, the whole group shouts something joyful like:

💎 **“Hope shines!”**

EXPANDED OUTLINE



I. HEAD

We started this year full of hope and many blessings have come, that happen because the hope that we cling to is Jesus Himself. Days are so fast and a lot has happened in our lives but may Jesus our hope remain in our hearts. In this season of Advent, let us take a moment to appreciate God's greatest gift to us—Jesus who brought hope to this hopeless world.

God's promise has been fulfilled through Jesus. The love, forgiveness, hope, and everlasting life with Him. He has done this because He loves us and because He doesn't want us to be sad and hopeless. That is why He sent His only son. He wants to see us happy and hopeful.

As we wait and anticipate the coming of our hope, let us prepare ourselves to welcome Jesus into our hearts and allow Him to fill it with love, joy and hope.

"For unto us a child is born, to us a son is given... and He will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." – Isaiah 9:6



II. HEART

We are all excited to celebrate this beautiful season of the year knowing that Jesus is the fulfillment of the hope we are longing for and praying for. As we prepare and celebrate Christmas, what do we need to do to always recognize that Jesus our hope is with us always?

1. Be prayerful - Pray together with your family and friends, attend mass and pray the Holy Rosary. Prayer makes us closer to God, it will lead us to His presence and our hearts will be filled with hope knowing that Jesus is with us. "You can talk to Jesus anytime, about anything! It's like having a best friend who is always listening.

2. Be grateful - Say thank you to your parents, friends, classmates and to all the people around you. Have a grateful heart and learn to appreciate everything you have. God has blessed us enough and we need only an open heart to recognize it. Through this we acknowledge that Jesus is truly present in our lives through the people and things He uses.

3. Be present - "Spend real time with the people around you. Put down the tablet, look at them, and listen. Your time is an awesome gift you can give.", cherish it and do not take it for granted. Be present in the moment and allow yourself to be a present (gift) to everyone because like us they also want to receive a gift. Let's bring hope to them through Jesus. When we give time to them, they will experience the presence of Jesus and same thing when people give time to us, we can also experience the presence of Jesus.



III. HAND

A. Kids at Play and First Steps (3-7 years old)

Activity: Coloring Activity

Material:

- Printed copy of the coloring page
- Coloring materials

NOTE: Please refer to Appendix A

B. Footsteps – Step Up (8-11 years old)

Activity: Hope Hands

Material:

- Paper (construction paper or plain)
- Markers or crayons
- Scissors
- Optional: stickers or glitter glue

Instructions:

- Kids place one hand on a piece of paper and trace around it with a pencil or marker.
- Kids then add 3–5 things that give them hope, such as: “I have hope in Jesus because...”
- “My family loves me.”
 - “I can try again.”
 - “God helps me.”
 - “I have good friends.”
 - “I’m learning new things.”
 - “I made it through tough times.”
- They can write in the fingers or inside the palm.
- Let them add color, hearts, stars, or symbols of hope.

- Encourage them: “Make your Hope Hand shine!”
- Hang them on a wall to make a Hope Wall or let kids take them home as a reminder.

Quick Processing: To help children name things that give them hope and see that hope is something they already carry with them.

C. Step up (11-12 years old)

Activity: Dyad / Group Sharing

Discussion question:

What are the gifts you received from God that give you hope?

How do you see Jesus as your hope?

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Thank you for letting your child/ren participate in our Kids Assembly for this whole year. We honor your patience and love for your kid/s that you allowed them to hear God's messages for them. As parents, you play a vital role in making sure that this hope is alive not only in your child's heart but also in your home. Here are three simple yet meaningful parent-child activities that beautifully reinforce to your children the values of kindness!" within the family:

1. **Giving Hugs** - Give a gentle hug to our child/ren every time we say the words Peace, Love, Hope, Joy, and Jesus. Let us encourage them to hug us back or place a hand on the heart. This shows how Jesus makes us feel safe and loved
2. **Pray Together** – Let us hold hands or place hands together. We, parent or guardian prays slowly, letting them repeat or listen like, "Thank You, Jesus." "You love me." "Give us peace." Let us end it with an "Amen." This shows that Jesus listens when we pray, even a simple prayer.

Jesus is our King – This is an easy crafting activity. Make a simple paper crown. As you place it on your child's head, say together: "Jesus is our King and He is my Hope." This shows that Jesus loves and cares for us like a King who is kind.

- I will be a good sister/brother to my siblings through sharing and supporting them.

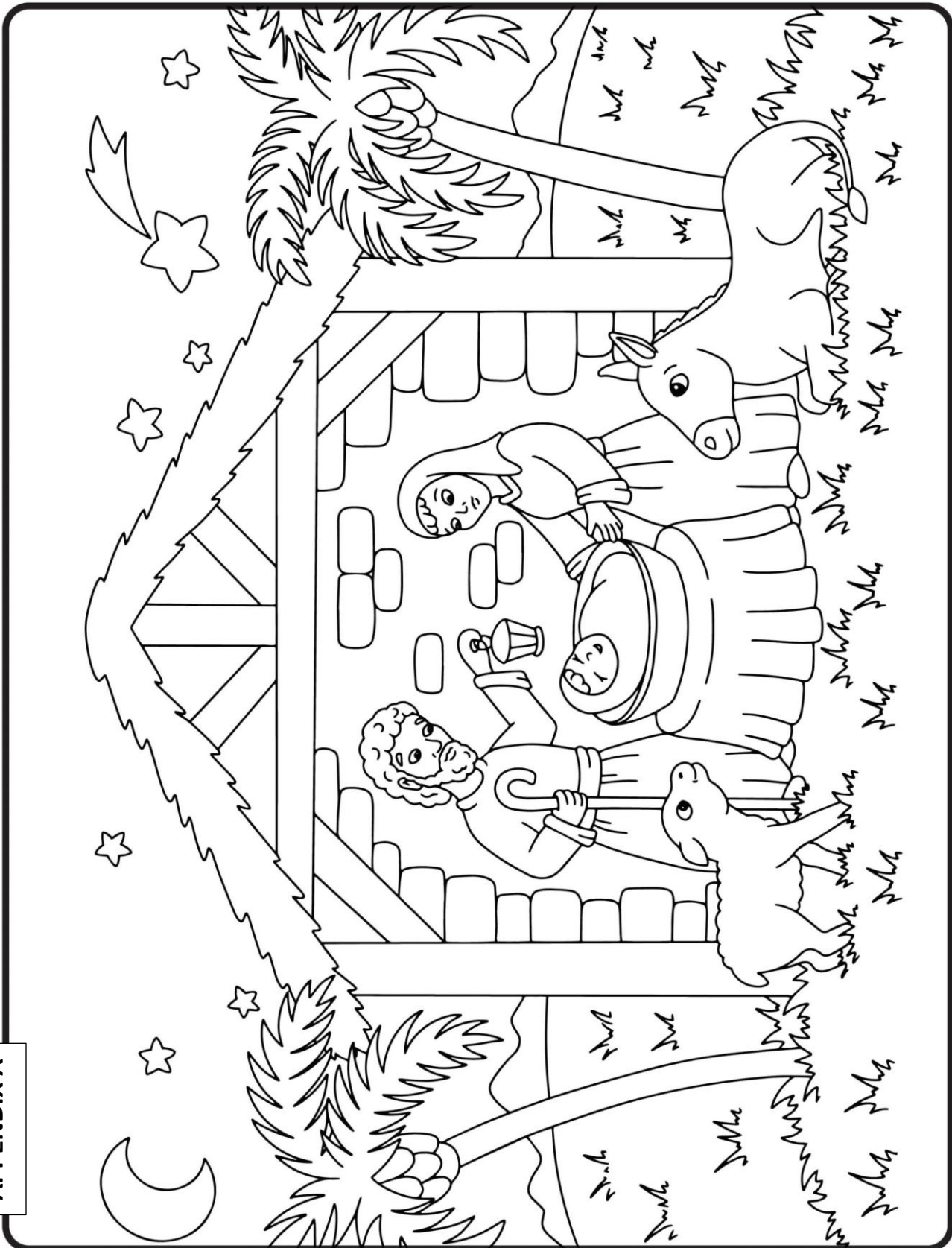
3. I will be an active member of MFC Kids
